



ERD Instructor Course

Equipment Needed:

- Mask and a pair of fins
- Primary regulator and secondary regulator
- Submersible pressure gauge
- Depth gauge
- Underwater compass
- Underwater timing device
- 2 Knives or cutting devices
- Exposure suit adequate for training conditions
- Weight system
- Surface signaling devices; 1 audible and 1 visual
- Logbook
- USCG approved personal flotation device (PFD)
- Gloves: latex or work
- Dive tables
- Buoyancy compensating device
- Compressed gas cylinder

*Why a Team of Three:

The optimum team structure is four, but this is not always feasible or possible. ERDI standards require a minimum team structure of three. With a team of three you can have: one diver, back-up diver (diver at 90) and a tender/supervisor. What qualifies as a team of three for this special: a team of three members of the same department or team. Divers from different municipalities, departments or teams cannot form a team for the purposes of this special pricing.
